TTC Advisory Committee on Accessible Transit

Application for 2026 membership



The Toronto Transit Commission has established the Advisory Committee on Accessible Transit (ACAT) to facilitate community input into the planning, development and implementation of accessible transit.

The Advisory Committee reports directly to the Board of the TTC. Working collaboratively with TTC staff, its role is to represent the needs and concerns of people with disabilities and seniors who use the TTC, as well as to provide guidance and policy advice on issues pertaining to improving accessible transit (i.e. TTC bus, subway, streetcar, and door-to-door Wheel-Trans services), using an intersectional approach to prioritize racial equity, diversity and inclusion.

People with intersecting identities including Indigenous, Black and racialized communities, the 2SLGBTQ+ community, newcomers, as well as people with multiple physical, cognitive, sensory and mental health conditions, experience compounding and complex accessibility barriers. ACAT members represent those voices and provide insight and advice on accessibility actions the TTC takes in this regard.

ACAT is comprised of fifteen (15) volunteer members. Positions on the committee are open to residents of the City of Toronto who have disabilities, are seniors, or represent the needs and concerns of seniors and persons with disabilities, as well as those with various intersecting identities that intersect with disabilities. Applicants should currently use the TTC and have an interest in and knowledge of accessible transit matters. Applicants must be willing to make a commitment of a minimum 10-15 hours per month, to attend meetings* normally held during regular business hours.

The TTC is committed to diversity, equity, inclusion, accessibility and antiracism (DEIAA). ACAT members are required to participate in mandatory DEIAA training in order to be eligible for membership on the Committee. This mandatory training aligns with TTC's Respect and Dignity policy, Diversity and Inclusion policy, Code of Conduct and Anti-Racism policy.

* Please note that meetings may be held online using a virtual platform that also permits members to join by telephone (e.g. Teams or WebEx).
