

Sheppard-Yonge Station – infrastructure improvements Temporary closure of Harlandale Avenue TTC entrance

Timeline: February 21, 2024 to October 2024

Work description and purpose

Starting on February 21, the TTC will begin work on the infrastructure at Sheppard-Yonge Station. The TTC's contractor will mobilize on-site in preparation for duct bank construction along the south curb lane of Harlandale Avenue. A duct bank is an underground reinforced concrete or metal container used for laying utility lines such as electrical.

Later in the spring, TTC will also begin work to rehabilitate the pavement of the bus loop, requiring its temporary closure until late 2024. What to expect during construction on Harlandale Avenue – February 21 to October 2024

- To facilitate work safely, the TTC entrance on Harlandale Avenue will be temporarily closed starting at 2:30 a.m. on February 21. Sheppard-Yonge Station has [several other entrances](#) to serve customers during this closure.
- To ensure a safe work zone and to maintain one-way, eastbound traffic on Harlandale Avenue, existing on-street Green P parking stalls will be temporarily restricted.
- No westbound access to Harlandale Avenue from Yonge Street.
- Work will involve excavating two shafts on Harlandale Avenue. The duct bank between the two shafts will be constructed underground using a trenchless method, requiring no further excavation.
- Work will typically take place daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Access to the Green P parking lot on Harlandale Avenue will be unaffected.


Harlandale entrance/exit closed

2:30 a.m., February 21 to 5 a.m., October 10, 2024

During this time, use the other entrances and exits at **Sheppard-Yonge Station**.
