Summary

Members of ACAT are appointed for up to a three-year term and one-third of the members are replaced each year.

Every year, the Board acknowledges the contributions of the five retiring ACAT members by presenting them with an in-appreciation plaque and certificate.

Recommendation

It is recommended that:

1. The TTC Chair present the retiring ACAT members with plaques and certificates indicating that they will receive a transit pass for the equivalent number of terms served, in recognition of their contribution.

Financial Summary

Equity/Accessibility Matters

ACAT is comprised of 15 members, of which at least eight must meet the definition of disability under the Ontario Human Rights Code. Several kinds of disabilities may be represented by these persons, including, but not limited to: physical or mobility, visual, hearing, communication, learning, mental health (psychological/psychiatric) and intellectual/developmental disabilities. In addition, the Committee also seeks representation from the seniors' community and advocates for persons with disabilities or who have demonstrated knowledge of, and interest in, accessible transit issues.
